HEALTH EDUCATOR II

JOB PURPOSE AND SUMMARY

Positions in this class are responsible for assessing community health promotion needs; planning, organizing and participating in resource development and intervention strategy design; and working with other Health Department professionals in carrying out health promotion activities.

KEY OR TYPICAL TASKS AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Participate in identification of community health promotion needs and development/implementation of health promotion activities.
- Design/develop health promotion activities for special communities/groups to effectively meet health promotion needs.
- Help plan and direct conferences, meetings, and workshops to further health promotion; plan, conduct or assist in implementing public health training screening activities.
- Work in connection with area community agencies and groups in the development of health promotion strategies and community resources.
- Serve as a consultant and a resource to divisions of the Health Department and assist in planning and implementing health promotion components of their activities.
- Work with unit supervisor to develop and implement organizational standards for health promotions.
- Develop and maintain effective working relationships with area organizations.
- Organize, participate in, and facilitate community health coalitions and task forces as assigned.
- Participate in development of grant applications.
- Perform other activities as assigned.

- A Master's degree in Public Health with a health education specialty, or a Master's in Health Education or Health Education/Health Promotion
- And two (2) years of experience in community health education.

WORK ENVIRONMENT AND PHYSICAL DEMANDS

There is some lifting and carrying up to thirty pounds of materials, supplies and equipment in the performance of job activities.

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
