There were 3 groups of 4-5 participants In each breakout room. Each breakout room was scheduled for 12 minutes. | Larger Group Activity | Yasmina | After the breakout sessions, participants came back together in the main meeting to share out. What resources or support is currently being offered to families to help with postpartum depression? • PeaceHealth-MWF (9-1pm) weight checks clinics for moms needing extra support are still going on for now but things could change in June. (These weight checks are for moms 2 days after discharge who might have been discharged early or things weren't going quite right. The check-ins provides an extra visit for them. • Legacy- 2-3 days after discharge. OB schedules them for 6 weeks out for non-high risk. It would be better if moms can come in sooner than 6 weeks. • BabyBlues Connections has a warm line you can text or call 24 hours a day. • Postpartum.net has a warm line and talks about COVID 19. |
