SURVEY REPORT FOR 06/23/2021 CHARTER REVIEW COMMISSION MEETING

This survey was drafted by the Clark County Charter Review Commission's Communications committee to survey the public on the Commission's proposed amendments to the Clark County Charter.

There were 435 responses to the English version of the survey and 3 responses to the Spanish version. Spanish version is reported separately and listed below the English version data.

Report data was pulled directly from screenshot results on SurveyMonkey.com to be deposited in this report and has not been otherwise downloaded or altered in any manner.

What's in this report?

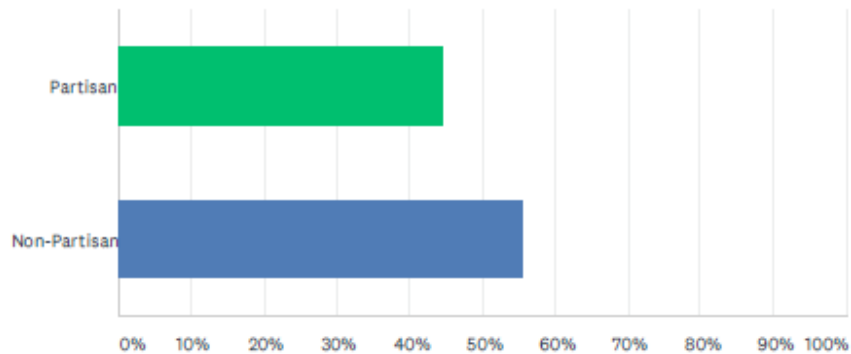
- Data is presented in visual chart form for English version of the survey for each question,
- followed by the supporting data for both the English and Spanish responses,
- followed by a word cloud of the most frequently used words in the response fields in the English version of the survey.
- An Excel spread sheet is attached with the many comments received in the open comment fields. For the six questions with open comment fields, there were 1374 comments submitted in the English version and 10 comments submitted in the Spanish version.

On record, but not attached to this report, 143 residents also submitted their email addresses asking to be added to the Charter Review Commission's email notification list.

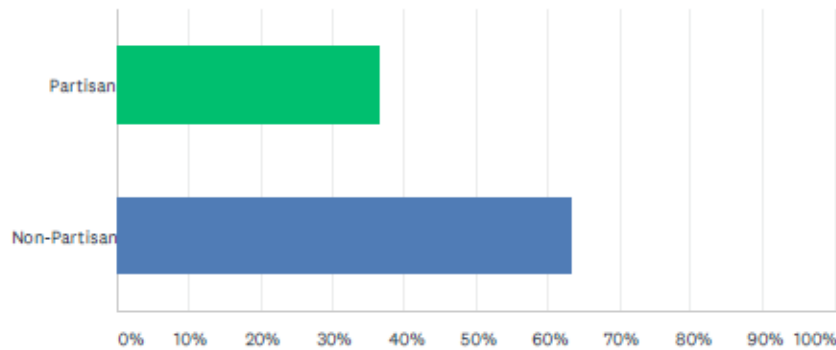

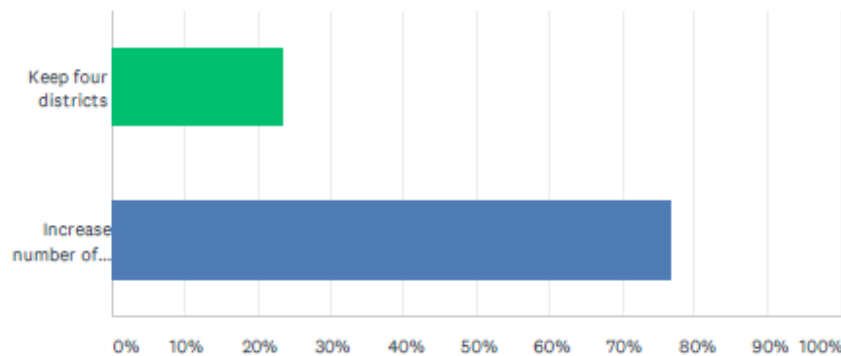

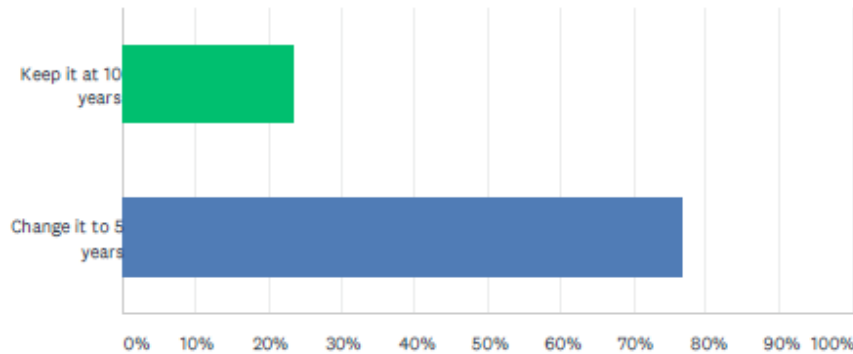

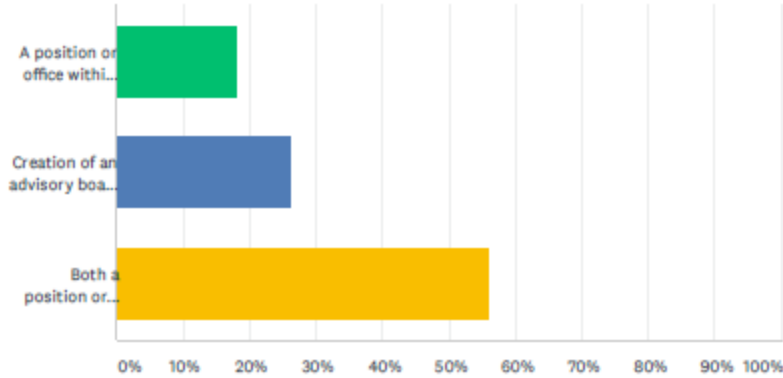

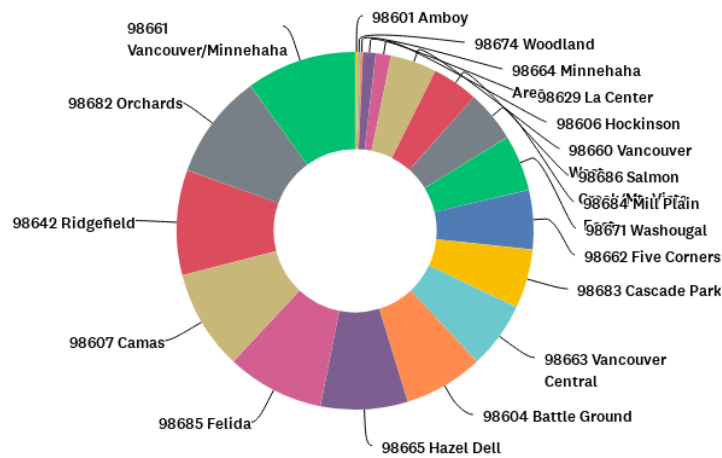
