We will be voting and electing members to the Truman Neighborhood Council. We are in need of a **secretary** and any other **volunteers** who are interested in working with and for their neighbors. We will also be voting on a few Bylaw changes (see page 3).

<u>Voting</u>: Article 10, Section 3 of our TNA Bylaws state: Members shall be required to show proof of residency in the Truman Neighborhood to be eligible to vote in Association elections.

As this is a video meeting you will not be able to show proof of residency, but we have come up with a solution: \*\*Please go into the CHAT session and type in your name and street address. If there is more than 1 member on the same video, please type in the name and street address of each person who wishes to vote. We will check names and address from our previous master list as well as the County's property information database (GIS). If you are a renter, please type "renter" after your address.

To all our new neighbors - Welcome!
Our meetings are a great way to get to know your neighbors & neighborhood, to get community
information, and learn about our events.

### Proposed changes to the Truman Neighborhood Association (TNA) Bylaws

To be voted upon at the April 25, 2022 TNA general meeting.

Key: Green text indicates additions. Red text indicates deletions.

#### **Article 9 - Officers/Council Duties**

Section 1. Chairperson: The Chairperson shall generally supervise the business and affairs of the Association. He/She shall preside over all Association and Council meetings. Should the Council consist of an even number of members the Chairperson shall be a non-voting Council member. He/She may represent the Association at other meetings in the community as needed. He/She shall act as the contact person for members via mail, email at trumanneighborhood@gmail.com, phone or direct personal contact. The Chairperson shall maintain all original and copies of official paperwork/documents pertaining to the business and affairs of the Association with copies provided to the Secretary for Association records. The Chairperson shall assign the duty and oversee the publication of the association's newsletter and maintain copies of them. The Chairperson shall be a signer on the Truman Neighborhood Association's checking account. The Chairperson along with the Council-at-Large shall safeguard the privacy of membership and crime watch rosters.

Section 5. Council as a whole: shall: 1) execute a duty of loyalty to safeguard the privacy of the membership and Crime Watch rosters; 2) appoint members and establish committees to perform necessary functions and represent the Truman Neighborhood Association; 3) make appointments to fill any vacancy on the Council until the next Association meeting where members will vote on

the appointee; 4) shall make informed decisions regarding Association issues and/or events for the good of the Association when impractical to present such information to the membership in a timely manner. All such actions shall be reported to members at the next Association meeting; 5) all Council meetings shall have a quorum of half the Council members plus one; 6) has the authority to correct any scrivener's errors that do not change the intent of the bylaws.

We have signs which are placed on the major streets in the Truman Neighborhood directing people to areas where there are yard sales. We place some directional signs out on the side streets, but you would be responsible for additional signs to make sure people find YOUR sale!

Volunteers are needed to place yard sale signs around the neighborhood Thursday evening 5/19, on the major streets.

Volunteers are also needed to retrieve the yard sale signs on Saturday evening 5/20 after 5pm.

#### If we do not get volunteers, participants will need to place all of their own signs out.

A map of all participating yard sellers will be emailed to you showing the location of other sellers. Please post this map at your yard sale. This will aid shoppers in getting around our neighborhood.

Also, please make copies of the map to give out to people. We found in the past that this really helps everyone.

We advertise our Neighborhood Yard Sale on Nextdoor, our Truman Facebook page and on Craigslist, including the map of our neighborhood showing where the yard sales are located.

### Pets poop. A lot!

You already know you need to pick up Fido's poop on the trail, but did you know that you also need to at home? Even in our rural areas, water quality testing shows high levels of poop from man's best friend.

While it's tempting to have your pets go poop in the woods by the creek, pet waste doesn't just decompose. It adds harmful bacteria and nutrients to local waters when it's not disposed of properly.

There are over 110,000 dogs in Clark County.

All those dogs mean a LOT of poop, 18 tons of it a day!

Depending on conditions, viruses, worm eggs and bacteria can live up to a year.

Be a good neighbor while you and Fido are out enjoying your walks around the neighborhood.

- \* Help keep your neighbors, their children and other pets safe by picking up after your dog.
- \* Keep your dog on a leash to maintain control as there are plenty of other neighbors walking their dogs.
- \* Respect your neighbor's property by not allowing your dog to relieve themselves in yards and flower beds. This not only is detrimental to lawns, bushes and flowers, but also attract other dogs to the area as well as coyotes.

### **To All You Industrious Vegetable Gardeners**

Many of us grow our own vegetables and many more are starting to grow small gardens. Good for you! You are getting fresh air & exercise while eating healthier.

However, if you have never grown zucchini you may find that the 2 or 3 plants you grew for only 2 people are starting to over run your refrigerator or kitchen counters.

If anyone finds that they have too much produce from their gardens, please consider donating your extra bounty to a food pantry. I have a rather large garden and always plant extra to help those less fortunate. Last year I and a few other neighbors donated 22 pounds of tomatoes and over 80 pounds of zucchini and yellow summer squash.

If you would like to drop off your extra produce to me, I will gladly take it to the Westside FISH food pantry on Harney Street. I usually go down on Mondays. I do this in conjunction with the Clark Neighbors Food Project and I am a Neighborhood Coordinator for my area as well as your TNA Chairwoman. ### **Drive-Thru Drug Take-Back** April 30, 2022 10 am - 2 pm

Bring any unused medication for safe, free disposal at these drive-thru Drug Take Back **Event sites in Clark County:** 

- Any prescription and over-the-counter medication including pills, liquids & inhalers will be accepted for safe, FREE disposal.
- Medications may remain in original containers and labels do not need to be removed. Medications not in original containers will be accepted too.
- Vaping devices & e-Cigarettes WITHOUT Batteries will also be accepted for free disposal at all event sites EXCEPT Cowlitz Indian Tribal Public Safety Department.
- Sharps and syringes will be accepted from noncommercial sources ONLY at the PeaceHealth SW Urgent Care event site. Use an approved Sharps container when transporting; if one is not available, use a rigid plastic container with a lid (ex: plastic milk jug) & label the container: WARNING-SHARPS DO NOT RECYCLE
- NO prefilled syringes will be accepted for disposal at any event site.
- For everyone's safety, participants will remain in vehicles & use a drive-thru process to dispose of unwanted & expired medications.
