It's good to smell the freshness in the air again—heck, it's good to see the sky again after the terrible forest fires in August that hit our area. October includes the annual **Make A Difference Day** as well—lots of activities for neighbors to participate in.

October is the **National Arts & Humanities Month** and we are able to really get involved right here in Clark County. Our own Laurel Whitehurst is the Coordinator for the **Arts of Clark County** whose project is outlined below.

How to volunteer with things and/or time—

Our NA treasurer Laurel Whitehurst has been a driving force in the Clark County Arts Commission since its inception, working alongside the late Senator Val Ogden. Her current work allows us all to participate to benefit less fortunate kids (and seniors, too) in our area. Here's what she does:

Laurel does this as a Volunteer for Arts of Clark County and she goes to the WHO program on Thursdays December through March, 5:30pm - 8 pm,. She sets up an art table in the hall or the back of the dinner room (depending on what else is happening). If the volunteers sit down and start doing things kids or adults come up and ask to join. She doesn't teach—she just supply and guide. Because she can't leave stuff there, she wheels it around in a suitcase.


When she gets more stuff than she can use or stuff that is more appropriate for another setting, she gives it to several other programs—all in Clark County— such as Independent Living at the YWCA. That program is for teens who have aged out of foster care, but are still not able to be on their own. She also donates supplies to the Children's Justice Center, mental health services provided through the Children's Center and Columbia River Mental Health Services. She has also given things to Friends of the Carpenters as they have a day-time shelter for homeless.

I receive requests from some residents who would prefer more frequent neighborhood association meetings- maybe even during the day.
