Truman Neighborhood Association Council Elections

Council Candidates: Cherryl Burkey for Chair; David Benedictus for Treasurer

Article 10 of our bylaws state that Council election voting will be done by ballot voting. Due to the fact that there are only two candidates, no volunteers to verify addresses & hand out ballots and this is a hybrid meeting, a motion will be accepted from a resident "to set aside this provision of our bylaws for this meeting and voting to be done by a voice vote". If the motion is seconded and passed by the membership, we will commence with the election. Should the motion fail, the TNA will be dissolved and become inactive.

Proposed change to the Truman Neighborhood Association Bylaws

To be voted upon at the March 9, 2023 TNA general meeting.

Article 6 – Dues/Funding

Proposed new section:

Section 4. In the event the Truman Neighborhood Association becomes inactive or dissolves, any funds in the treasury will be donated to the Family Community Resource Center at Harry S. Truman Elementary, located at 4505 NE 42nd Ave, Vancouver, WA 98661, through The Foundation for Vancouver Public Schools.

Reason for this new section: the TNA currently has Articles of Incorporation as a Non-Profit with the State of Washington. As we are not in compliance with state law as to the number of Council members, we will not be renewing our Articles of Incorporation in April 2023.

To ensure that our funds go to the Truman Elementary FCRC, as directed in our current Articles of Incorporation, this new section to the bylaws is being proposed. It will also save us \$20.00 a year.

There has been a lot of concern about safety in our neighborhood due to the lack of law enforcement presence. But be assured that our Deputies are out there patrolling & watching our neighborhoods.

I want to share this news release posted on FlashAlert: (paraphrased)

On 12/04/2022 around 11:50pm, Deputy Weed located a stolen vehicle traveling in the area of NE Andresen Road and NE 40th Street.

He attempted a traffic stop. The vehicle eluded recklessly and failed to comply with the traffic stop.

The driver failed to negotiate a turn, went off the road and collided with a sign. The driver exited the car and ran. Deputy Weed gave chase on foot and successfully apprehended the driver.

The suspect was found to be in possession of several hundred Fentanyl pills and Methamphetamine.

Community News -- Tips -- Reminders

Recycling & Trash



During the past year or so, there has been a sharp reduction in

recycling exports markets because of the low quality of the materials. Much of what was being sent was contaminated with food waste, broken glass, or other materials that could not be readily recycled.

So, please: *Recycle right from the start!* (www.cityofvancouver.us/recycleright)

• Tips for Shredded Paper

We know that there will be a need to shred paper as long as there are bills and credit card offers in the mail. However, **shredded paper is NOT accepted in curbside recycling carts**.

Some options for shredded paper:

• Drop your pre-shredded paper off at a transfer station for secure recycling at no cost. Shredded paper from a truck or service provider gets baled and does not have to be sorted before it heads to a paper mill.

• Add shredded paper to a worm bin or compost bin at home.

• Check the RecycleRight app to get the names of private services that will take your paper for shredding for a fee.

Remember that if you have doubts as to whether something can be properly recycled, please put it in the trash. So, if these options for shredded paper don't work for you, it's OK to put it in the garbage cart. No guilt.

 Perhaps you would like to recognize the effort and hard work of your waste truck drivers with a <u>note of appreciation</u>.
