

	AN ORDINANCE proposing an amendment to the Clark County Home Rule

6	WHEREAS, the Clark County Home Rule Charter allows for a redistricting committee to

11	WHEREAS, the current Clark County Home Rule Charter redistricting process allows for
	the two major parties to submit names to for the Council to nominate members to the
12	redistricting committee; and

14	WHEREAS, the Clark County Home Rule Charter similarly limits the redistricting
15	committee to five (5) members; and

17	WHEREAS, the Clark County Council desires to put a proposed amendment to the Clark
18	County Home Rule Charter that, if enacted by a majority of the voters, will require the
19	County Council to select six (6) members to the redistricting committee without the two
20	major parties submitting candidates for council selection; and

22	WHEREAS, the Council is considering the matter at a duly-advertised public hearing and
23	concludes that adoption will further the public health, safety and welfare; now, therefore,
24	the public manner and public hearth, safety and wellare, now, incresore,

	Within sixty (60) days of receipt of federal decennial census data from the state redistricting
37	commission or its successor, No later than September 30 of the year the decennial United States
38	Federal Census is conducted the council shall establish a five (5) seven (7) member redistricting
39	committee and appoint a redistricting master for that committee who is an employee in the Clark
40	County Geographic Information Services department (or successor). The redistricting master
41	shall be qualified by education, training, and experience to draw a redistricting plan. The council
42	shall appoint four (4) six (6) persons to the committee, two (2) from each major political party
43	from a list of five (5) submitted by the party's central committee. The four (4) six (6) members of
44	the redistricting committee shall appoint a fifth seventh member who shall be chair. If a majority
45	of the committee members cannot agree on a committee chair within thirty (30) calendar days
46	after the appointment of the committee members the council, no later than sixty (60) calendar

Members of the redistricting committee shall serve without salary but shall be compensated for reasonable out-of-pocket expenses. The redistricting committee shall, within thirty (30) calendar days of its appointment, meet and appoint a redistricting master. The redistricting master shall be qualified by education, training and experience to draw a redistricting plan. If the redistricting committee cannot agree on the appointment of a redistricting master within thirty (30) calendar days, the council-shall appoint a districting master.

11 12 13	Within two (2) months after appointment, the redistricting master shall draw a redistricting plan for the county that is consistent with the following and submit the plan to the committee for adoption:
14	(1) Districts shall have a population as nearly equal as is practicable, excluding
15	nonresident military personnel, based on the population reported in the federal
16	decennial census as adjusted by RCW 44.05.140.
17	(2) To the extent consistent with subsection (1) of this section the plan should, insofar as
18	practical, accomplish the following:
19	a. District lines should be drawn so as to coincide with the boundaries of local
20	political subdivisions and areas recognized as communities of interest:
21	b. Districts should be composed of convenient, contiguous, and compact
22	territory. Land areas may be deemed contiguous if they share a common land
23	border or are connected by a ferry, highway, bridge, or tunnel. Areas
24	
25	separated by geographical boundaries or artificial barriers that prevent
	transportation within a district should not be deemed contiguous;
26	c. Whenever practicable, a precinct shall be wholly within a single legislative
27	district: and
28	d. Equalizing population within districts should be done with as few changes to
29	existing boundaries as possible.

31	(3) The committee shall exercise its powers to provide fair and effective representation
32	and to encourage electoral competition. The committee's plan shall not be drawn
33	purposely to favor or discriminate against any political party or group. The committee
34	shall conduct a public hearing at least one week before proposed adoption. The
35	redistricting committee shall adopt or amend the redistricting plan within thirty (30)
36	days of submission to the committee. The redistricting plan shall be adopted as
37	submitted by the redistricting master or as amended by two thirds majority a vote of
38	five (5) of the seven (7) members of the redistricting committee. Upon adoption, the
39	plan shall be filed with the council by the redistricting committee. After submission
40	
41	of the plan, the council shall have thirty (30) calendar days to amend the committee's plan. If the council amends the committee's plan, the amendment must be approved

by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of council members, and the area amended may

not include more than two (2) percent of the population of any council district. No later than eight (8) six (6) months after receipt of the census data, the council shall adopt by ordinance a redistricting plan that is consistent with Section 6.6 (1).(2). (3). The adopted redistricting plan for the county must follow precinct boundaries established by the council prior to that year's candidate filing period. Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective on the 10th day following adoption and shall result in the submission of the proposed amendment to the Clark County Home Rule Charter to the voters at the next eligible general election. Should a majority of voters vote in favor of the amendment, the amendment shall be incorporated immediately into the Clark County Home Rule Charter upon certification of the election results. Section 3. Instructions to Clerk. The Clerk of the Council shall: A. Record and transmit a copy of this Ordinance with the Clark County Auditor; and B. Cause notice of adoption of this Ordinance to be published forthwith, pursuant to Clark County Code 1.02.140. C. Provide a copy of this Ordinance to Code Publishing.
