SATURDAY, MAY 17: HAZEL DELL PARADE OF BANDS

Hazel Dell Parade of Bands starts early with the Lions' Club breakfast at 7:00 am.

REMEMBER that the roads will start closing at 8 am.

The parade begins at 10:30 am and ends around 1:30 pm.

The 60th Annual Hazel Dell Parade is a once-a-year event allowing over 25 SW Washington schools music programs the opportunity to "strut their stuff" while other entries add to the festivities with animals, clowns, dances, car clubs, politicians and other local businesses. It brings over 20,000 people into your neighborhood! Thank you for your understanding and support for this annual community event. It is one of the largest parades in the State of Washington.

Parade day is great fun and we want to ensure you are part of it all.

This year's theme is "Band Together for a Better Tomorrow" and the Grand Marshall of the parade is Ila Westergard, life-long community member and past president of our Neighborhood Association! WHDNA FAQs:

Who can join the neighborhood association?

Anyone who lives, works, or who attends school (or who has a child who does) within our boundaries can be a member. There are no dues, no fees, and no other requirements.

What does membership entail?

As a member of the West Hazel Dell Neighborhood Association (WHDNA), you have the right to attend meetings, vote on initiatives and projects, participate in activities, and join us at our events. You're also invited to volunteer for a committee or to help with an event.

What does a neighborhood association do?

WHDNA organizes events, advocates for the concerns of neighbors, provides a conduit to Clark County leaders, and fosters a sense of community, cooperation, and camaraderie among the residents of West Hazel Dell.

How does volunteering work?

Most volunteers spend just a few hours a month helping their neighbors plan fun events, supporting their community, and attending membership meetings. Any member of WHDNA may volunteer – it's incredibly easy to get started.

Is this the same as an HOA?

Not at all! Neighborhood Associations in Clark County, WA like WHDNA are absolutely not Homeowner's Associations. Any member of WHDNA, has voting rights, may volunteer or serve on the Board, and pays no dues or fees to participate.

We have no interest in how tall your garden gnomes are! (But, if you ARE in an HOA that is within the boundaries of WHDNA, we want you to know that you are also welcome to join us in our efforts to build community in Hazel Dell and we'd love to see you!)


NE Hazel Dell Avenue (between 99th & 88th Streets) will close at 8:00 a.m.

1-5 Freeway 78th Street Exit closes at 10:00 a.m.

Hazel Dell Avenue-Highway 99 officially closes 8:15 a.m.—10:15 a.m.

<u>Parade begins at 10:30</u> and will completely restrict traffic on the parade route which goes south down NE Hazel Dell Avenue, crosses the freeway east at Minnehaha (63rd Street), continues north on Highway 99 until turning east of 78th Street and disbanding between business complexes.

Freeway and parade route will reopen after the last parade entry passes NE 78th St., approx. 1:30 p.m.
