

Annexation High Level Overview





Annexation and the Growth Management Act

- Washington's Growth Management Act (GMA) anticipates that areas within the Urban Growth Area (UGA) will be annexed within 20 years
- Facilitates the provision of urban services to areas that have or are intended to develop at urban densities
- Several methods of annexation- direct petition, election (vote), interlocal agreement, Fire District interlocal, etc.
- The legislature has provided some financial tools to support annexations of UGAs into incorporated areas, but they are insufficient to maintain services levels



Annexation Process Considerations

- Annexations of any significant size are complex and require careful and intentional planning and collaboration, and a multi-year process
- Interlocal agreements related to all necessary annexation considerations must be negotiated in advance
- Each major service area will require its own discussions and process
- Financial modeling indicates new tools will be needed to provide urban services to the VUGA
- Most annexation methods require some level of community engagement



Annexation and the Growth Management Act

- Urban level of development are allowed in the UGAs for the following reasons:
 - Cities extend urban services
 - GMA allows it with expectation of annexation
 - Preserves resource lands outside the UGA- farms, forests, recreation, etc. In alignment with GMA
- State enabled revenue tools and GMA structure generally intend for cities to provide urban services and counties to provide social/human services




Recent Vancouver City Council discussions related to annexation

- In 2023 and 2024, as part scoping for the Comprehensive Plan update, Council asked for information on the financial impacts of potential annexations.
- Staff modeled the following four scenarios and presented findings to Council at a March 17 workshop:
 - Fire District 5 boundary
 - Water Service area boundary
 - Full Vancouver Urban Growth Area (VUGA)
 - Orchards SR-500 to Padden Parkway



City Services already provided in VUGA






City services in the VUGA

- Who is on city services now
 - Water District
 - Sewer District
 - Fire District 5
- Considerations:
 - Most properties with City water and sewer service have already agreed to annexation through utility covenants
 - Eligibility for fire district annexation method




Fire District 5 in VUGA- 95K residents served






Water Utility Service Aare in VUGA- 95K residents served






Sewer Utility Service Area in UGA- 51K residents served

Key Considerations

Annexation requires City and County agreement on a variety of complex issues

- Transfer of services
- Transfer of facilities
- Transfer/management of special districts
- Transfer of revenues collected to serve specific areas
- Transfer of staff
- Transfer of records



Collaboration Opportunities

Potential short-term areas for collaboration

- Understand interest in jointly exploring potential annexation scenarios
- State legislation: joint advocacy for better financial tools to facilitate balanced annexations
- Develop framework for working together to get to an interlocal agreement
 - How do we structure overarching coordination efforts?
 - O How do we identify the appropriate annexation scenario?
 - How will we work together to identify transition needs and requirements for all major services areas?
 - O How do we communicate information to the community?




Collaboration Opportunities

Potential longer-term areas for collaboration

- Adoption of City development standards prior to annexation
 - Ensures new development meets urban standards while interlocal being developed
 - Allows incremental development of more integrated land uses
- Delegation to City for certain services
 - Development review and permitting
 - Public Safety
 - Continue coordinated park funding efforts
- Agreement on a preferred annexation scenario and adoption of an interlocal agreement to facilitate a smooth transition with no disruption to essential services

Closing/Next Steps

Anything but the smallest annexation scenario is multi-year process that requires collaboration and partnership

- We look forward to hearing from County Councilors and leadership on their interest in exploring future annexation
- This will inform potential next steps and any future discussions, including:
 - Schedule series of exploratory meetings
 - Develop joint state legislative agenda to augment financial tools for sustainable, balanced annexations in alignment with GMA
