RESOLUTION NO. 2025-09-09

A RESOLUTION relating to the importance of access to high-quality pregnancy-related health care¹ and declaring a commitment to addressing root causes of critical access gaps for Medicaid (Apple Health) clients in Clark County, WA.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, early and regular prenatal care promotes healthy pregnancies and is associated with fewer pre-term births, higher birthweight infants, and fewer maternal and infant deaths; and
4 5	WHEREAS, inadequate prenatal care increases preventable risk for pregnancy complications and adverse birth outcomes for pregnant individuals and their babies; and
6 7	WHEREAS, early and regular prenatal care has an economic value through reduced healthcare costs, educational gains and improved productivity; and
8 9	WHEREAS, the Healthy People 2030 target for receiving early and adequate prenatal care is 80.5%; and
10 11 12	WHEREAS, state birth certificate data analyzed ² by Clark County Public Health show 78.4% of Clark County births covered by private insurance met criteria for adequate prenatal care in 2024, 2.1% below the Healthy People 2030 benchmark; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS, state birth certificate data analyzed ² by Clark County Public Health show 69.2% of Clark County births covered by Apple Health Insurance (i.e., Medicaid) received adequate prenatal care in 2024, 11.3% below the Healthy People 2030 benchmark; and
16 17 18	WHEREAS, there is a sustained and measurable difference in access to adequate prenatal care for pregnant individuals with Apple Health Insurance (i.e., Medicaid) compared to their privately insured peers; and
19 20	WHEREAS, inadequate access to care disproportionately impacts systemically disadvantaged racial and ethnic groups and people of limited economic means ² ; and
21 22	WHEREAS, every pregnant resident of Clark County should have the opportunity to access high-quality pregnancy-related health care; and
23 24	WHEREAS, local health care delivery systems report increased costs, strained and diminished workforce capacity, and increased patient complexity; and

¹ Pregnancy-related health care is a term used throughout this resolution to describe the health care delivered during pregnancy, childbirth, and after pregnancy. This term includes prenatal/antenatal care, labor and delivery/intrapartum care, and postpartum care.

25 26	WHEREAS, health insurance/payer type should not drive differences in access to pregnancy-related care; and
27	WHEREAS, Medicaid pays for more than 40% of births in Clark County; and
28 29	WHEREAS, taxpayer dollars invested in Medicaid services must result in the provision of high-quality pregnancy-related care for Clark County residents; and
30 31	WHEREAS, Clark County Public Health values equity and the belief that communities with the greatest needs must be prioritized to improve health for all; and
32 33 34	WHEREAS, the mission statement of Clark County Public Health is to work alongside community partners to address the root causes of health so all people and all communities can thrive; and
35 36	WHEREAS, the Board of Health is responsible for preserving, promoting and improving public health; and
37 38	WHEREAS, the Board of Health has directed Clark County Public Health to develop a Medicaid Access to Prenatal Care workplan; and
39 40	WHEREAS, maternal/child/family health and access to health care are Foundational Public Health Service services in the state of Washington; and
