- WHEREAS, on October 30, 1985, Clark County instituted the Legacy Lands Program; and
- **WHEREAS**, since 1985, the Legacy Lands program has preserved more than 5,500 acres of conservation and recreation lands; and
- **WHEREAS**, acquisitions have been throughout Clark County on every major lake and stream system, namely Vancouver Lake Lowlands, Burnt Bridge Creek, Salmon Creek, Whipple Creek, East Fork Lewis River, North Fork Lewis River, Lacamas Creek, Lacamas Lake and the Washougal River; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Legacy Lands program has leveraged more than \$38.6 million in non-county resources to accomplish conservation objectives; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Legacy Lands program has forged successful partnerships with local municipalities, nonprofit organizations, state and federal agencies, and community groups to complete conservation projects and engage thousands of residents in environmental education and stewardship activities; and
- **WHEREAS,** Legacy Lands protect critical fish and wildlife habitat, preserve forests and shore lands, conserve agricultural lands, enhance property values, improve water quality, and provide recreational opportunities such as hiking, riding, fishing, swimming, picnicking, paddling and wildlife viewing.
- NOW, THEREFORE, we, the Clark County Council, do hereby proclaim October 2025 as
