



# 2024 Annual Homeless System Numbers Report



# About the Report

- Each year, over 40 local agencies contribute data to help tell the story of homelessness in Clark County.
- Data in the report is pulled from HMIS, CFTH's hotline call data and the American Community Survey.
- The data covers calendar year 2024 (January 1 to December 31, 2024)
- “Homeless” within the report = HUD’s definition of literal homelessness.



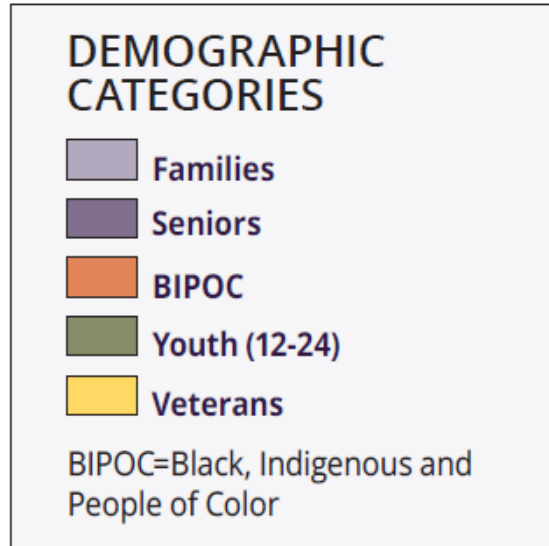
# Difference between Annual System # Report and PIT count report

**PIT Count = counts all people experiencing both sheltered and unsheltered homelessness during one day in January.**

**Annual System # Report = counts all people who accessed our Homeless Crisis Response system during a whole year.**

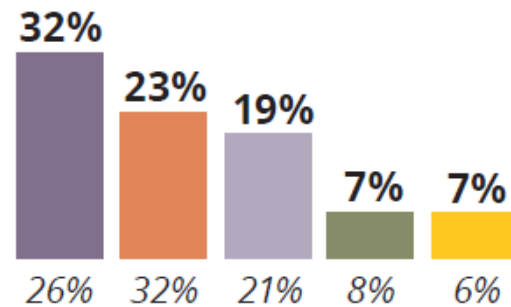


# Experienced Homelessness at any point in 2024 (households)



## EXPERIENCED HOMELESSNESS AT ANY POINT IN 2024

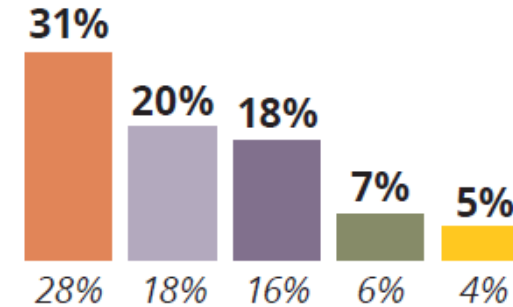
2024=3,804 / 2023=4,447

**62,975** calls to the housing hotline in 2024.



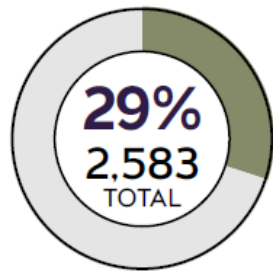

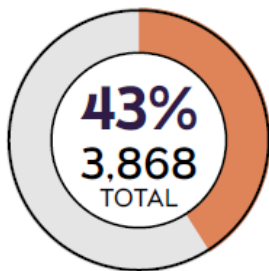
**8,894** people from **3,804** households were homeless in Clark County at any given time during 2024. Of those 8,894:

**IDENTIFIED AS CHILDREN UNDER 18**



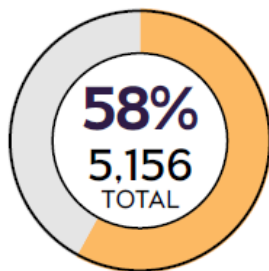

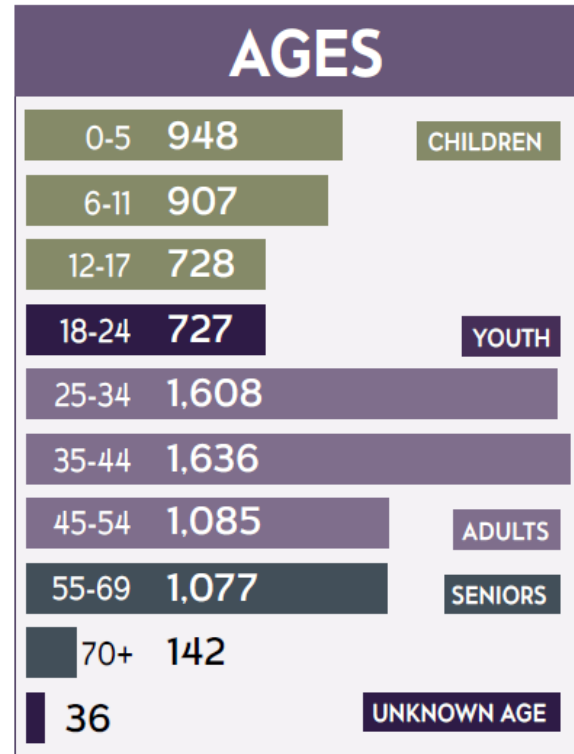

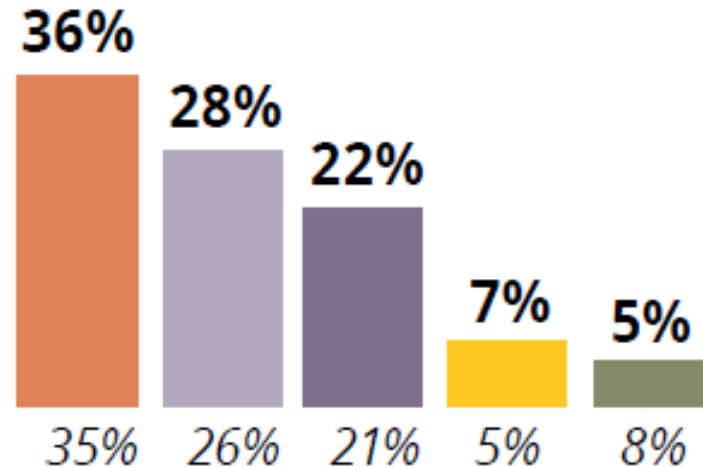

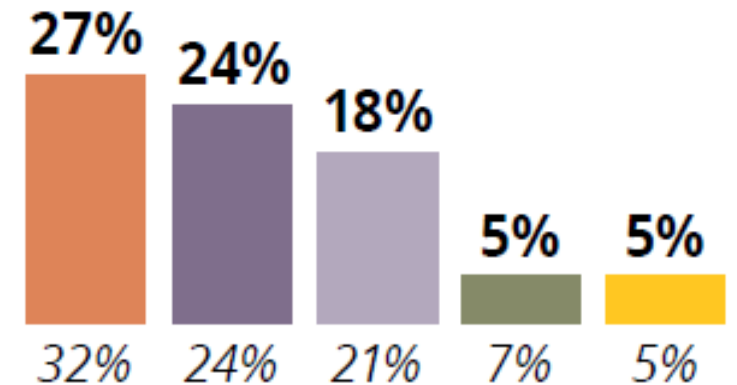

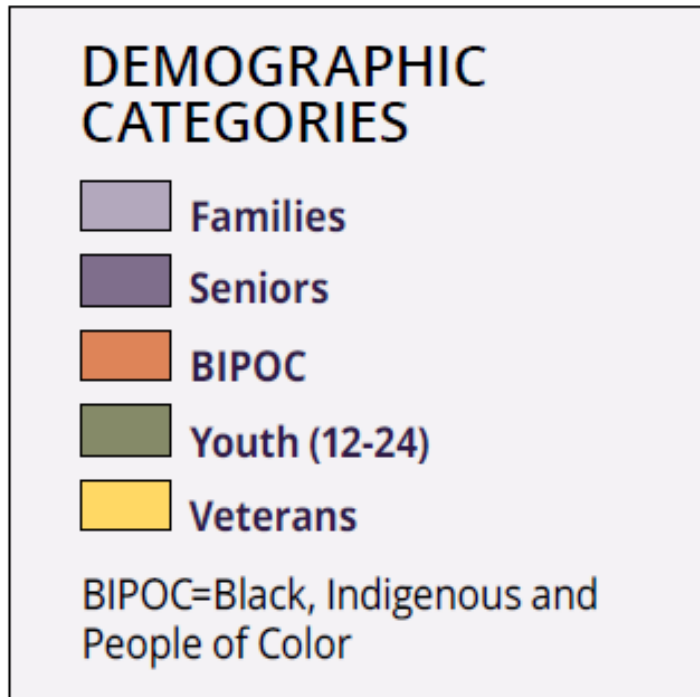

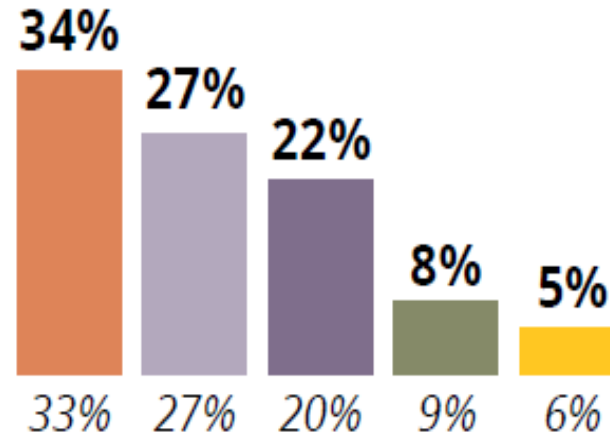
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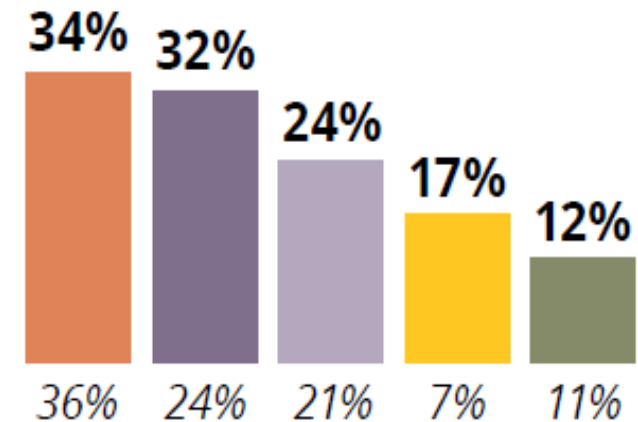
# Households assessed and entering housing programs

2024=3,648 / 2023=3,784



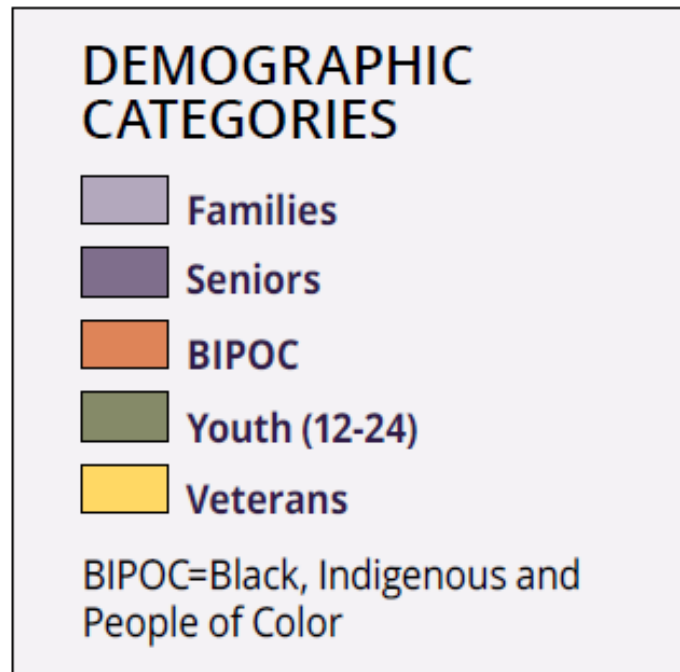
**ENTERED ONE OF 52 HOUSING PROGRAMS**

8% increase in senior households entering programs.

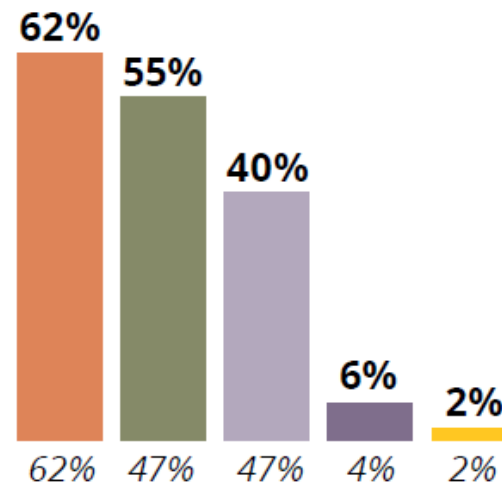
10% increase in Veteran households entering housing programs.

# Households housed or stabilized through Diversion and Prevention



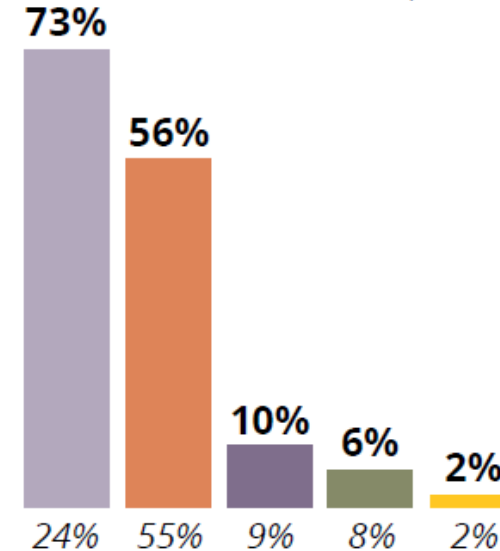
**HOUSED THROUGH COACHING AND ONE-TIME FINANCIAL SUPPORT**

**STABILIZED THROUGH RENTAL ASSISTANCE**

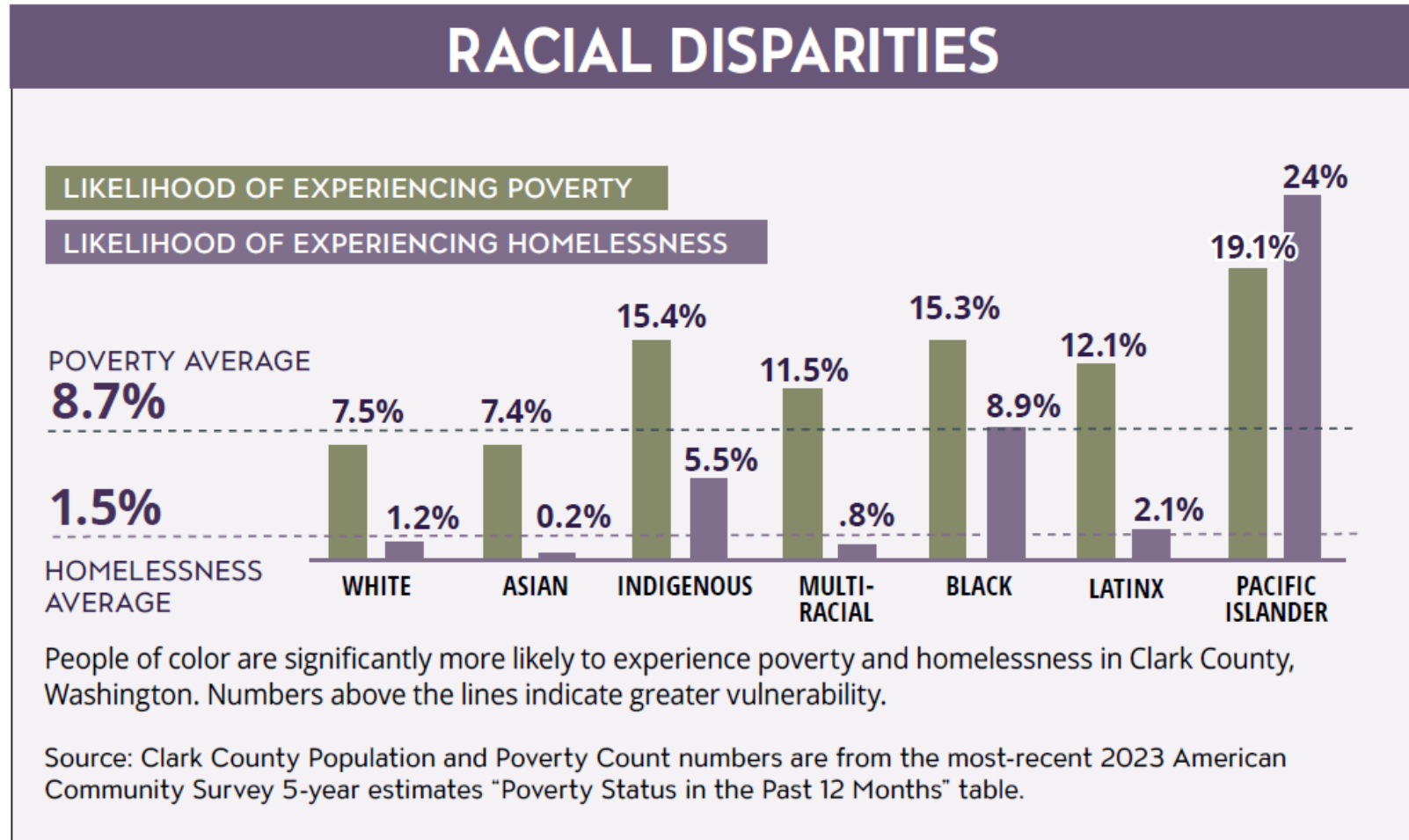

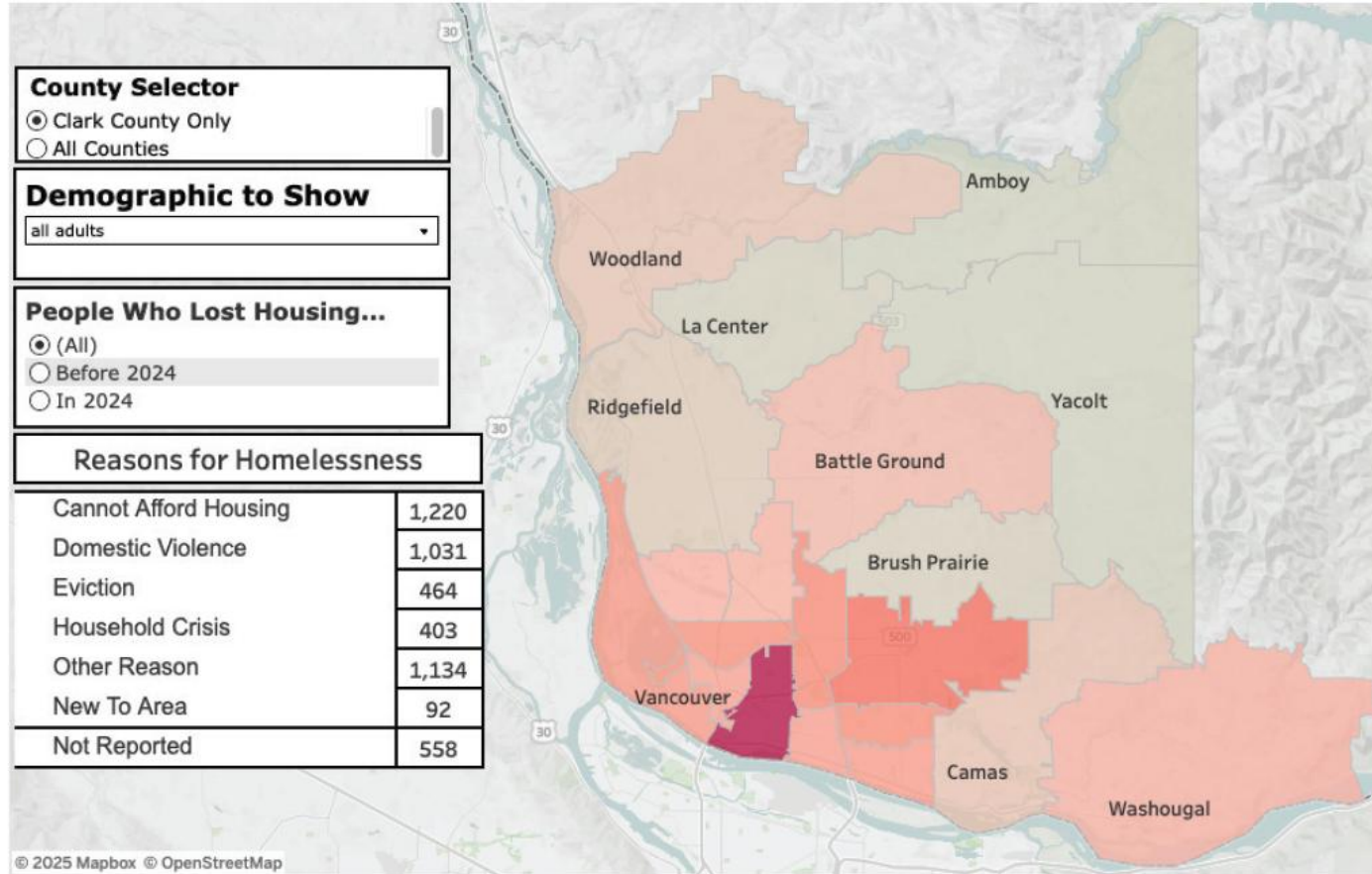
8% increase of youth households housed through Diversion
